FINAL IQAA REPORT

As part of our strategic plan and ongoing development of the school, we are committed to implementing a quality assurance process. Independent Schools are fortunate to have an agency which helps schools undergo a formal internal evaluation, which is comprehensive and has national benchmarks against which we are able to compare ourselves.

The Independent Quality Assurance Agency (IQAA) has been formed to provide quality assurance through evaluation of schools. The following principles and functions are fundamental:

- maintenance and improvement of standards and quality of education offered to pupils in schools;
- encouragement of an attitude and atmosphere of constant internal self-evaluation in schools;
- assuring governing bodies and all other educational authorities concerned, in an unequivocal and accessible way, of the quality of their schools;
- providing information and advice on quality assurance to any schools, associations and educational authorities who seek it; and
- promoting appropriate accountability.

Attached please find the IQAA Internal Evaluation Report compiled during our 2018 IQAA self-evaluation. The document details the process, and reports on self-reflection by staff, parents and pupils, as well as comments pertaining to all the survey results. The report covers areas which are “to be celebrated” as well as those that are “concerns” for us. A copy of our IQAA Mentor’s report compiled at the conclusion of the process, which fully endorses our evaluation, is included.
